Similarly information sharing on ginning and textile sector research is need of the time.

At the end I am again thankful to ICAC, CABI Governments of Network countries, KBF and especially the Govt. of Bangladesh that they provided us the opportunity to collaborate and gather at Dhaka. We must make use of this opportunity and utilize all the time for the purpose of enhancing collaboration and sharing recent knowledge and experiences.
